IN RE: SELECT COMMITTEE ON JUSTICE TEACHING

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

The purpose of the Select Committee on Justice Teaching is to advise the Supreme Court with regard to essential elements that will guide successful educational programs concerning our legal system and to oversee the development and implementation of partnerships between the judiciary and schools within their communities.

Judge Stephen D. Spivey has resigned from the bench effective December 31, 2006, thereby creating a vacancy on the Select Committee. The following person is appointed to complete the remainder of his term, which expires on June 30, 2008:

Circuit Court Judge, Seventh Judicial Circuit


St. Johns County Representative:
