



FIFTEENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT JUDGE LUCY CHERNOW BROWN, above, and Amy Borman, general counsel for the 15th Circuit, presented a Justice Teaching Day interactive program for all third-grade classes at Everglades Elementary School in Weston that focused on space aliens trying to take away some of their rights. "We asked the children to guess what it was the aliens wanted to take away from them, guiding them into the concept of the aliens wanting to take away some of their rights," Brown said. "We had earlier supplied each of the third-grade teachers copies of the Constitution to hand out to the children, and they had already done a basic lesson about the Bill of Rights, so the children were prepared to discuss the concept of their rights. It was interesting to see the rights the children listed, which ranged far from those listed in the Bill of Rights, and included things like the right to eat lunch, the right to go to recess, the right to learn, the right to be safe, and the right to take restroom breaks."
